

## H. W. CRABB DEAD.

Henry W. Crabb, the well known vineyardist, died Thursday evening at his home near Oakville.

Deceased was born in Jefferson county, Ohio, January 1st, 1828, and was therefore 71 years of age. He came to California in January, 1853, mined first in Placer and Nevada counties, and then engaged in farming near Haywards, Alameda county. In 1865 he came to Napa county, and went into the grape growing and wine making industries. He leaves one daughter, Mrs. Wm. T. Johnson of Washington, D. C.

The product of Mr. Crabb's To Kalon wine cellar has become famous throughout the United States and has found favor in Europe.

At the World's Fair in Chicago he had an exhibit, including a fountain of wine, that brought him many prizes.

Mr. Crabb was also a patron of the breeding of fine stock and he owned a number of fast trotters and pacers. He was always prominent in every enterprise that would advance the material interests of Napa county, and his demise is a real calamity to the community.
